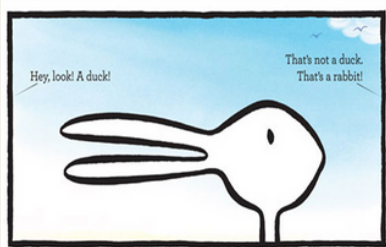


# Pedagogical Documentation

Here are 5 examples of Pedagogical Documentation methods that can be used with children:

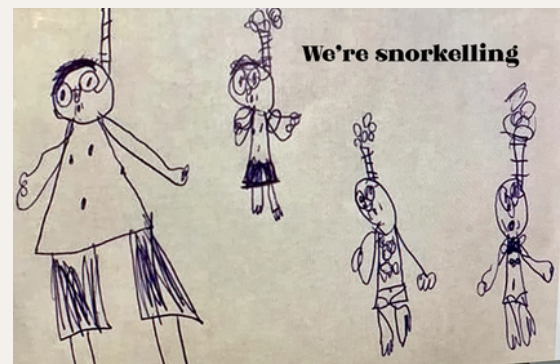
- **Portfolio** - Educator sits down with each child regularly to see which documents to add in the child's portfolio
- **Learning Stories** - write down what the children are doing during the day as authentically as possible.
- **Project wall** - Add all documents related to your project on the 'Project wall'.
- **Story crafting** - Child tells a story and educator writes it down, word for word, as the child tells it.
- **Planning Sheet** - Add what the children have been doing during the week. This gives documentation that you can further reflect on when moving in to the next week.



It is a process of the learning that is taking place, not just a display;

Listening to, observing, recording, interpreting, and exhibiting learning experiences;

Communicating, documenting, and sharing information regarding learning experiences in a respectful, appropriate, and inclusive manner (well-being);



Making sure that information is in a visible location such as on an app or at the front entrance of the room. Including parents/caregivers/guardians in the learning experiences taking place (belonging) (through regular communication, workshops, activities, or events).
